Accreditation: A process of validation in which schools are evaluated.

Field Study: Also known as "field trip" : a visit to an area outside of the normal classroom where students can see, learn, and experience new things.

IB: International Baccalaureate: A global network of schools whose mission is "to develop inquiring, knowledgeable, and caring young people who help to create a better world through intercultural understanding and respect."

Learner Profile: A set of attributes, with universal value across cultures, that define an internationally-minded student.

Lower School: Grades K-5

Middle School: Grades 6-8

PYP: Primary Years Program: The lower school program of the IB for students aged 3 to 12.



SAIS: Southern Association of Independent Schools

Units of Inquiry: Transdisciplinary units, structured around a "central idea," that empower students to develop a lasting understanding of the knowledge. Units normally last around six weeks.

Hickory Day School is one of 15 schools in North Carolina (and the only school in the greater Hickory area) that is authorized to offer the International Baccalaureate Organization Primary Years Programme (PYP) to students in grades kindergarten through fifth. OUR HISTORY Education well crafted since 1993



A group of families first proposed the idea for Hickory Day School in 1991. A steering committee was formed to guide the establishment of a school that combined a nurturing environment with a curriculum enriched by hands-on learning experiences. In the fall of 1993, Hickory Day School opened.

Hickory Day School is an independent, non-sectarian, college-preparatory, co-educational school in the greater Hickory area that offers instruction to students in kindergarten through eighth grade.

In its tenth year, Hickory Day School applied for candidate status with the International Baccalaureate Organization (IBO). Having successfully completed the candidate phase, the school first hosted the visiting IBO authorization team in April, 2005. In July of that year, the school received notification of the committee's decision, and Hickory Day School became the fourth school in the state to become an authorized International Baccalaureate Primary Years Programme.


What is IB?

The International Baccalaureate Organization is a nonprofit, Swiss educational foundation dedicated to a curriculum that emphasizes critical thinking and exposure to a variety of points of view to encourage intercultural understanding and acceptance of others by young people.

The programs help students grow intellectually, socially, aesthetically, and culturally. They teach students to think critically and encourage them to draw connections between areas of knowledge and to use problem-solving techniques and concepts from many disciplines. They give students an awareness and understanding of their own culture and of other cultures' values, and ways of life. IBO students are highly recruited by colleges and universities around the world.

- The International Baccalaureate Organization aims to develop inquiring, knowledgeable and caring young people who help to create a better and more peaceful world through intercultural understanding and respect.
- To this end the organization works with schools, governments and international organizations to develop challenging programs of international education and rigorous assessment.
- These programs encourage students across the world to become active, compassionate, and lifelong learners who understand that other people, with their differences, can also be right.

TUITION & FEES



STUDENT FEE

An annual \$300 student fee is charged per student to cover the costs associated with school supplies, testing, and single-day field trips.

APPLICATION FEE

ATHLETIC FEE

A fee of \$75 is charged per sport per student to cover the cost of uniforms, equipment, and expenses.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Financial assistance in the form of grants for tuition may be offered based on available funding for qualifying students. Families in need of financial assistance should contact the school business office for additional information. HDS is also an approved recipient of NC opportunities and disabilities grants.

A fee of \$75 is charged with a student's initial application to HDS. This fee covers the admissions testing process.

Hickory Day School does not unlawfully discriminate on the basis of race, color, gender, religion, national or ethnic origin, or sexual orientation. Because HDS is not an appropriate placement for every child, the admissions process is selective.
